Second meeting of the Establishment Committee for the Formation of a Pacific Islands Academy of Science and Humanities

- First face-to-face meeting of the Committee
- Funds contributed by the Sasakawa Peace Foundation and ISC RFP-AP
- The Academy will be registered as a Charitable Trust and domiciled in Samoa
- Up to 10 Founding Fellows to be in place by the launch of the Academy. Remaining Fellows will be elected once the Academy is established.
- Aim to launch in Samoa during the Commonwealth Heads of Government Meeting (CHOGM) in October 2024
- Delegation of five EC members to attend SIDS4 conference in Antigua and Barbuda in May 2024.
