Questions for Discussion 1

All tables:

- (Q1) What role should the ISC play in global policy processes? Discuss whether the ISC should focus on advocating for science, delivering scientific advice, facilitating access to expertise, or putting issues on the global agenda.
- (Q2) How can the ISC best identify, mobilize, and engage experts from its membership – across natural and social sciences – to contribute to international and regional policy processes? What are the practical implications of this? Discuss practical strategies for leveraging ISC's membership and integrating expertise from diverse disciplines.
