



8 Associations & 5 commissions

- ➤ Union Commissions are reviewed and renewed at each IUGG General Assembly. At present:
- ➤ CCEC: Climatic and Environmental Changes /
- ➤ CMG: Mathematical Geophysics /
- ► GRC: Geophysical Risk and Sustainability /
- ➤ SEDI: Study of the Earth's Deep Interior /
- **► UCPS: Planetary Sciences /**



IUGG MEMBERSHIP BENEFITS

- > allows member country and its scientists to participate in all IUGG activities, including those of the Associations and related scientific bodies
- > enables scientists of member country to be elected to IUGG office and to be part of a global network of researchers
- ➤ enables member country to participate in **IUGG governance** and to be represented by a voting National Delegate to the IUGG Council
- provides opportunities for international leadership in which scientists from member country can be involved
- > enables member country to be represented on international interdisciplinary bodies (committees, working groups, commissions) established under IUGG and ISC, and other international scientific organisations



IUGG MEMBERSHIP BENEFITS

- ➤ allows member country to organize and host scientific meetings, including IUGG GA and Association SA, providing **economic benefits to the host country** and the opportunity of wide participation of scientists from the host country
- ➤ enables scientists from member country to access funding opportunities such as the IUGG Grants Program or IUGG Symposia Support to enhance collaborative international research and provide opportunities for early career scientists
- > enables scientists from member country to access publications and geoscience educational activities
- ➤ fosters international cooperation, effective coordination, and science diplomacy increasingly needed for complex global geodetic and geophysical studies
- > enhances a nation's **scientific prestige** by promoting greater international awareness of the contributions of the nation' scientists

- **Total Income (2025):** ~USD 675K
 - ~97% dues from member countries
- Total Expenditures (2025): ~USD 740K
 - ~65% to 8 Internat. Associations (directly; or through funding programs)
 - Other expenditures: Union Commissions, collaboration with ICTP on science education, administration



IUGG Member Countries and dues

- 74 member countries (2024)
 - 59 paying countries
- Membership dues (2025)
 - USD 2,525 88,375 (per country)
 - 1 unit: USD 2,525
 - Member countries pay a number of units depending on GDP and number of participants at IUGG General Assemblies
 - Price of 1 unit follows the U.S. inflation

Associations Finances

- Large part of income from IUGG
- 2015: IUGG Council decided to allow Associations to introduce individual membership programs to earn more money.
 Introducing an IUGG individual membership was not supported.
- Associations use most of the money for travel support of scientists in need (ECSs, female scientists, scientists from lowand mid-income countries) to attend scientific meetings or to reduce registration fees
